The following is a checklist for writing an academic style paper. Use this to ensure all your academic papers are complete and correctly structured.

- Have you addressed all the items in the assignment prompt? Use the assignment instructions as a checklist to be sure you've covered everything. Use this resource on [Aligning Your Paper with the Assignment Prompt](#).
- Did you begin your paper with an [Introduction](#) paragraph that ends with a [Thesis Statement](#)?
- Have you included multiple well-developed [Body Paragraphs](#) and integrated concepts, ideas, or information from required readings and/or outside research into those paragraphs? Use this additional guide on [Integrating Research](#).
- Did you create a [Conclusion](#) paragraph that reiterates the overall thesis, the main points made, and shares the significance of the topic?
- Have you used an [Academic Voice](#) throughout your paper?
- Did you correctly cite your sources as you used them, using an [Academic Citation Style](#)?
- Did you create a References or Works Cited page for the sources you used, using either [APA](#), [MLA](#), or another required formatting style?
- Have you met all the requirements within the assignment instructions, including word count, number of sources, and other requirements?
